Entrance exams in June took place in the mixed form. We had 31 applications from 14 countries, out of which we accepted 20. As of today, 11 students from 6 countries (Slovakia, Serbia, Ukraine, Albania, Sudan, Germany) enrolled in the first year.

We hosted 13 mobility students (7 Ljubljana, 6 Vienna), some of them online, others physically present.

The cognitive science program has also been going through a process of new accreditation. As part of the new rules, a quality assurance panel for the program
