Here's some information for you about what and how have we been doing with our cognitive science program in the last year. Read on.

Study

In winter semester, we hosted 15 mobility students (7 Ljubljana, 8 Vienna).


In June, we held entrance exams for the programme. We had 37 applications from 21 countries. 26 applicants handed in the entrance exam, out of which we accepted 21. Eleven students enrolled in the first year (5 from Slovakia, 1 from Australia, Canada. India, Spain, UK, Russia).

Science

We have been busy working on several research projects, out of which a 1.5 mil euro Horizon Europe **Twinning project TERAIS** is the most important one. The grant is aiming at transformation of the workplace to a research centre of excellence, which spans management restructuring, research support, people development and internationalization, communication and workplace culture. In terms of research, it focuses on cognitive robotics and artificial neural networks, aiming to contribute to the development of trustworthy and human-friendly robots, teaming up with two strong partners: Italian Institute of Technology in Genoa and University of




<u>Hamburg</u>. This also influences the students of cognitive science program via opportunities to get involved in experimental research in human-robot interaction (lead by our very own alumna Xenia Poslon!).



Our annual **MEi:CogSci conference** took place in Bratislava on June 13-15 and was organized by us with generous help of our students. The conference included an alumni panel in which the alumni from all partner universities share their perspective and post-hoc view on the programme. Bratislava was represented in the panel by Rado Škoviera, Yanchi Tóth and Laura Gschwandtner (thank you all!). The conference was collocated with a **summer school on Trustworthy Human-Robot Interaction THRISS**.

The annual Czech-Slovak conference **Cognition and artificial life (KUZ 2024)** took place in Olomouc this year in June. <u>Ten people from our department attended</u>, including three undergraduate students. The <u>conference proceedings</u> are freely available.



One big news: **Prof. Igor Farkaš** – the founder and guarantor of the Mei:CogSci Bratislava study program has received the <u>Scientist of the year 2023 Award</u> in the category "<u>Personality of international collaboration</u>" for significant scientific results in the field of artificial intelligence obtained in collaboration with foreign partners, and for the development of an international interdisciplinary master's programme in cognitive science. Congratulations, Igor, well deserved!
